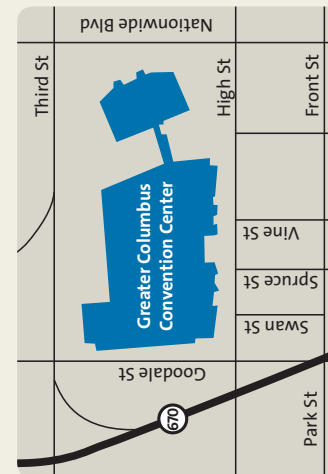

KEYNOTE PRESENTER



Gordon Graham

Gordon Graham is a retired 33-year veteran of California law enforcement. During his tenure as a police professional, he was awarded his teaching credential from California State University, Long Beach. He later graduated from the University of Southern California with a Master's Degree in Safety and Systems Management.

Subsequent to this, he graduated from Western State University with a Juris Doctorate. His education as a risk manager and experience as a practicing attorney, coupled with his extensive background in public safety, have allowed him to rapidly become recognized as a leading professional speaker with multiple areas of expertise.

A former street cop, supervisor and manager, Mr. Graham took his formal education as a risk manager and combined it with his education and experiences as an attorney to become President of Lexipol — a company designed to standardize policies, procedures and training within fire departments around America. Gordon is the co-founder and co-owner of the popular website FireFighterCloseCalls.com and helped the IAFC develop their version of the same concept — FireFighterNearMiss.com.

Over the last decade, Mr. Graham has spoken to more than 300,000 different law enforcement, fire personnel, dispatchers and EMS professionals from around the world (including NFA and IAFC) — no doubt some from your department. In 1995, he was presented with the Governor's Award for excellence in law enforcement training by Governor Wilson (sole recipient).

In 2005 he received recognition from the IAFC for his lifelong work in improving firefighter safety and performance. In 2008 he received the lifetime achievement award from California POST. His penetrating wit coupled with his vast knowledge in multiple disciplines provides the enlightened listener with an information packed seminar.



Chief Rick Lasky (Ret.)

Chief Lasky is a 34-year veteran of the fire service as chief of the Lewisville Texas Fire Department for 12 years. Rick followed in his father's footsteps beginning his career as a firefighter in the suburbs on the southwest side of Chicago. While in Illinois, Chief Lasky received the 1996 International Society of Fire Service Instructors "Innovator of the Year" award for his part in developing the "Saving Our Own" program.

Throughout his 30-plus years in the fire service he has served as a career and volunteer firefighter. He served as the co-lead instructor for the H.O.T. Firefighter Survival program at FDIC for more than 10 years, is a long-standing editorial advisory board member for Fire Engineering Magazine and also serves on the FDIC advisory board. Rick is the author of best-selling books "Pride and Ownership — A Firefighter's Love of the Job" and "Five Alarm Leadership: From the Firehouse to the Fireground" published by PennWell Books, and is the co-host for the radio show "The Command Post" heard on Fire Engineering Talk Radio. Rick holds an AAS Degree in Fire Science from Columbia Southern University and was selected as the CSU 2012 Distance Education and Training Council (DETC) Outstanding Graduate. He was also honored in 2012 as an inductee into the Chicago 16 Inch Softball Hall of Fame.



Henry E. Wang, MD, MS

Dr. Wang is Professor and Vice Chair for Research, Department of Emergency Medicine, University of Alabama School of Medicine. Originally from New Jersey, he completed medical school at UMDNJ-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School (New Brunswick, New Jersey) and Emergency Medicine residency training at Christiana Care Health System (Newark, Delaware). Dr. Wang was previously at the University

of Pittsburgh, where he completed fellowship training in Emergency Medicine, obtained Master's degrees in Public Health and Clinical Research, and served as academic faculty, distinguishing himself as a national leader in out-of-hospital resuscitation and airway management.

Dr. Wang is a leading researcher in prehospital emergency care. His primary focus is on the safety, effectiveness and system-wide organization of paramedic airway management techniques. Findings from his studies have motivated changes in the organization of prehospital care systems as well as the techniques applied in resuscitation. Dr. Wang is currently a lead investigator for the Alabama site of the NIH-funded Resuscitation Outcome Consortium.



Paul E. Pepe, MD, MPH

Professor of Medicine, Surgery, Pediatrics, Public Health and Riggs Family Chair in Emergency Medicine, University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center and the Parkland Health & Hospital System; Director, City of Dallas Medical Emergency Services for Public Safety, Public Health and Homeland Security; Medical Director, Dallas Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS) for Counter-Terrorism and Disaster Mitigation and the Dallas Metropolitan Area BioTel (EMS) System, Dallas, Texas.

Dr. Pepe heads an academic EM program based at the county emergency trauma center, Parkland Hospital, and the North Texas Poison Control Center. As the City of Dallas Director of Medical Emergency Services for Public Safety, Public Health and Homeland Security, and jurisdictional Medical Director for the regional EMS system annually, he oversees about a quarter million EMS incidents and 3,000 paramedics/first responders in Dallas and the surrounding cities in Dallas County. He is also the Medical Director of Special Services for the DFW International Airport, the Dallas Police Department and the Dallas Metropolitan Medical Response System for Counter-Terrorism and Disaster Mitigation.

An extremely distinguished academician, Dr. Pepe is renowned for a grass-roots, "street-wise" style in planning, implementing and overseeing a "systems" approach to saving lives. Both operationally and through clinical trials, his programs have resulted in some of the highest cardiac arrest and trauma survival rates worldwide.
